

ICC JUDICIAL ELECTIONS 2017



VIDEO OF CANDIDATE PANEL DISCUSSIONS

The Coalition for the ICC strongly believes that only the most-qualified leaders should be elected to the International Criminal Court (ICC) and Assembly of States Parties (ASP) for both bodies to function independently, fairly and effectively.

On 18 September 2017, as part of our long-standing Campaign on ICC/ASP Elections, the Coalition organized panel discussions with the candidates vying for judicial election to the ICC bench at the 16th session of the ASP in December 2017.

ICC member states Benin, Bosnia, Canada, Croatia, Ghana, Italy, Japan, Lesotho, Mongolia, Peru, Uganda and Uruguay have nominated 12 candidates for election to the six judicial vacancies.
